



Relationship & Sex Education Local Arrangements

At St Stephen's CofE First School RSHE is part of our curriculum offer. RSHE education sits in line with our Church ethos to develop and support students understanding of their self and how they interact with others in society. It sits in line with our Church school values: peace, love, hope, compassion and forgiveness and our insistence that at St Stephen's we respect one another and our planet.

'We undertake to follow the principles in the Church of England Charter for faith sensitive and inclusive relationships education, relationships and sex education (RSHE) and health education (RSHE).'

We use Islington PSHE / RSHE scheme of work as a basis for delivering these lessons. RSHE is delivered in line with our Science Curriculum on animal life cycles, PSHE curriculum and other curriculum areas as and where applicable. It is adapted to be age appropriate and suitable for the needs of our students and is progressive and sequential developing key concepts and ideas. Students may discuss concepts taught in RSHE / PSHE as part of their wider curriculum.

Withdrawing Students from RSHE Education:

DFE guidance clearly states that a parent has the right to withdraw their children from Sex education where it goes beyond what is taught in the National Curriculum for Science.
