Policy Statement

At St. Stephen's CofE First School, spirituality is viewed as an integral and important part of school life. This provides an opportunity for everyone to develop a sense of self, community and unity as a whole school. Spirituality is part of the school's contribution to promoting spiritual, moral, social and cultural development. It is a good time to ask big questions and to stop and reflect. Through this and in the general ethos of the school we seek to promote our vision statement and its Christian ethos.

'That every child is special in the eyes of God, and we believe that all people should love, care for and respect one another and our planet.'

Children are given the opportunity for reflection and prayer. There are opportunities for stillness and a chance to think. Everyone is special and unique in our school. We have a strong belief in tradition, community and the multicultural makeup of our school.

The worship of the school is based on Christian values which are linked to Christian theology.

We identify the values of:

Love: God loved the world so much. (John 3.16) As we are loved by God, we are called to respond in how we love God and each other (1.Cor 13.40-5)

Forgiveness: We seek to forgive others as we are forgiven by God. (Matthew

6.12)

Values Education

We blend Christian teaching and Values Education in order to create opportunities for children to develop physically, emotionally, personally, socially, mentally and intelligently so that their self-esteem and well-being is sound and supported by ever growing emotional intelligence; leading to an understanding of their rights and responsibilities as young citizens. The systematic introduction of a common values vocabulary allows children to access moral and ethical thought.

1. Naturalists: Loving God outdoors.
2. Sensates: Loving God with the senses
3. Traditionalists: Loving God through ritual and symbol.
4. Ascetics: Loving God in solitude and simplicity
5. Activists: Loving God through confrontation
6. Caregivers: Loving God by loving others
7. Enthusiasts: Loving God with mystery and celebration
8. Intellectuals: Loving God with the mind.
9. Contemplatives: Loving God through adoration.
